CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE)

CHS offers many ways for students to explore a career field before making a commitment to a college major. These students can learn job skills at a job site or in a simulated work environment. Careers such as computer technology, graphic and web designs, investments, video and television production, culinary arts, and engineering/robotics trades are explored through CTE and elective courses. All CTE courses have been approved by the University of California A-G system to satisfy subject requirements. All CTE classes award high school credits that count toward Practical and Fine Art graduation requirements.

ACADEMY OF MEDIA & ENTERTAINMENT (AME)

AME creates an interdisciplinary studies cohort for a group of students by grade level. Cohorts gain knowledge and exceed standards across a curricula of English, Social Studies, Science, and Broadcasting. While encompassing core curricula, students explore through media and experiential learning all aspects of production management, creative development, production, and post-production work with professional quality equipment and materials.
